1. **Align Labels on Paths**
Sometimes you have a need to align path labels to the path. The easiest way to do this is to turn the cross-hairs on the path and use the Align Labels To Paths tool. Select the path(s) in your drawing. Next, right-click the path and select the Align Labels To Paths command from the shortcut menu. The cross-hairs will show on the path and the labels should appear to the right. If you do not see the labels, try re-drawing the path. [Click image to view at full size] Figure 1. Using the Align Labels To Paths command to align labels. The cross-hairs are used to select the path to align the labels to, the labels will align themselves to the path.
2. **Center Multiple Points at the Same Location**
If you have more than one point in a drawing you may want to center them at a common location. This is possible with the Center Multiple Points command. To center multiple points at a common location, select the points that you wish to center and then run the Center Multiple Points command. A box will be created around the points you selected. [Click image to view at full size] Figure 2. The Center Multiple Points command centers multiple points at the same

location. 3. Change the Color of the Label Text Sometimes you might want to make the text on a label a different color than the rest of the drawing. Go to the Properties shelf, select the text and the label, and use the Color box to change the color of the text. [Click image to view at full size] Figure 3. Processes AutoCAD supports a large number of processes, each of which perform a particular function. Processes are called from a command prompt, often via a scripting language. The commands are organized in the operating system command prompt by the AUTOCOM.EXE file, which lists the processes supported by the program. It is possible to add more processes to the program, but this has to be done with a script created using AutoLISP. The AutoCAD processes are available in the following categories: Image processing Image processing is the process of manipulating images, either for the purposes of image enhancement or creation of a new image. The main processes used in image processing include: Rasterize (converts raster data into vector data) Raster images can be converted to vectors using the rasterize command. The converted image may be edited in a rasterized image editing application and the editable rasterized image can be saved back to a raster image file using the save command. Edmonton's celebrated public art masterpiece, the Millennium Bridge, was unveiled with great fanfare last month by the Edmonton-Meadowlark Regional District. The bridge was designed by internationally renowned artist Michael Hayden and completed in 2006 to celebrate the province's Millennium year. Since then, the board and public have been discussing the future of the popular artwork. A meeting on Tuesday to discuss the future of the bridge failed to reach a consensus, leaving the board without a plan of action. After the meeting, trustees noted there is a legal issue with the bridge's sign, which was painted by Robert Newell of Newell Gallery on a government grant. Newell's work is owned by the Board of Edmonton, which is in the process of negotiating a contract with the board. According to the president of the board, no one else has the right to paint the sign. Trustees heard a number of other concerns about the bridge's future. Some trustees suggested closing the bridge to pedestrians and to cyclists. In other cases, it was suggested closing the bridge to people with disabilities or restricting access to one of the bridge's four approaches. Each of the options were met with considerable opposition. The majority of the board felt the best way forward was to keep the bridge open for everyone to use, but that the board should pursue every opportunity to raise funds for a new Millennium Bridge. "What we want to do is maintain the public art piece, and we want to honor the legacy of the artist, Michael Hayden, and the Millennium Project, and keep that open for all the public," said Elaine Fischler, president of the board. A subcommittee is being formed to explore options to raise money to create a new Millennium Bridge. There was much debate about the \$3.3 million it would cost to create a new Millennium Bridge. Board president Elaine Fischler argued that \$3.3 million for a new bridge makes more sense than spending money to repaint the current bridge. "It would have taken us 14 years to get to \$3.3 million, to paint the bridge. It's a much better investment," Fischler said. "We need
