Figure 1. Basic Introduction: A look at how to use AutoCAD's ribbon When AutoCAD first debuted in 1982, it offered only a single desktop window with a few icons. As AutoCAD grew in popularity, the application was also expanded to provide features that were unavailable in other CAD programs, including distance scaling and architectural layout. In 1986, AutoCAD was completely redesigned to make it look like it was designed for a computer mouse, with the ribbon, menus and toolbars located on the left side of the screen and the drawing canvas on the right. This new version of AutoCAD, known as AutoCAD LT, was intended for small businesses and hobbyists and offered fewer features than the previous version. In the early 1990s, AutoCAD was expanded with an updated user interface and a color interface. Although this version, AutoCAD R13, was difficult to learn, it became the standard for all other versions. AutoCAD 2014 was released with a new user interface called "classic," which eliminated the ribbon and toolbars, and introduced a style that was closer to traditional CAD programs than previous versions. AutoCAD 2015 was the first to support the Linux operating system, and 2017 was the first to support the Windows 10 operating system. This section provides an introduction to the basic features of AutoCAD, followed by a more detailed look at the ribbon, toolbars, drawing canvas, interface features, and menu options. Basic Features A user interface is the primary interface between users and AutoCAD.
